


Bundilla 2023 Sale Results

Improving Quantity and Quality of Lambs in the Bundilla Nucleus

Bundilla is recognized as Australia's Leading Maternal Merino with over 40 Years focus on improving the maternal performance of our dams.

Year on Year we have promoted to the industry that Balance is Best!

This means gradual gains across all traits has always been the focus at Bundilla. Identifying dams that consistently produce top performing twin progeny that visually get classed in to the top groups are a key to our success.

Identifying dams that are balanced across (LS) Litter size, (ERA) Ewe Rearing Ability & (MWWT) Maternal Weaning Weight is helping us refine and consolidate our position as Australia's Leading Maternal Merino.

Dam Performance the Key

The main job of a merino ram is to deliver the performance of that bloodlines maternal ewe base. I often get questioned on why we collect so much data on our sheep & how do we use the information we collect.

My first answer is we are trying to identify the most profitable dams within our flock and multiply their genetics through the flock. That is why ASBVs are so valuable to the industry, as they can place a value for the maternal, wool & carcass performance of a rams family background.

This can only happen through collecting long term full pedigree information on the dams performance within the Bundilla stud nucleus, and no one has been doing this as long as our family.

What YFat tells us at Bundilla

I keep having people asking me about 200 or 300 Day FAT and how it fits within our breeding program.

We have been muscle scanning our rams and ewes for over 27 Years and have developed an understanding of how it impacts our breeding program.

We have always concentrated on positive fat genetics but not extreme fat.

Extreme Fat tells me that a ewe or ram has not set themselves up properly for a life time of production either through carcass traits, reproduction or wool vale.

What we see is that once a ewe has reached its terminal adult weight and does not need the energy that it has required for the early period of its life it then starts laying fat down to benefit its reproduction cycle and this is very different to early life fat.

So in my opinion YFAT is important. You certainly want positive fat but extreme fat is a missed opportunity for a more profitable ewe across her life time, as we say...

Areas of focus included **Genetic improvement**, **Sustainability**, **Technology** and **Innovation**, **Market Trends**, and **Animal Welfare**.



Health & Welfare in the Bundilla Breeding

One of the biggest limiting factors in merino breeding is the extremes of our environment that we aim to achieve genetic gain. From having 2 dought years in 2017 to 2019 to experiencing three 800mm plus years from 2020 to 2023. It does not get more difficult than that. Selecting for improved worm resistance, dag score and feet has been a major focus over this wet period and there has been some interesting observations in the process.
